## A MESSAGE FROM CITY MANAGER **DEBRA ROSE**

I hope everyone had a safe and fun New Year with their friends and family. The start of 2023 was a wet one, with several storms bringing heavy rain to Southern and Northern California. Both areas saw flooding along the coastline and in major cities. Thankfully, Lake Forest was not impacted by any of the severe weather conditions.

The City identifies potential threats and how to mitigate them through the creation of our Local Hazard Mitigation Plan. We assess our local creeks, rail crossings, and other potentially problematic areas in the City and develop a plan to reduce the level of severity of any incidents that may occur. We are updating that plan now. See www.lakeforestca.gov for more details.

This is also the time of year we begin to work on our budget. Our healthy budget allows us to allocate funds to projects such as park renovations and innovative programs such as the community gift card program. To help stimulate our local economy after the impacts of COVID-19, the City launched its first buy-one-getone gift card good at local businesses. The initiative benefits both Lake Forest businesses and residents. Nearly 40 restaurants and retail stores registered, and 702 gift cards were purchased within the first month of the launch. You can read more about the program in this issue.

Your input is encouraged as we put together our 2023-25 two-year budget. Please watch for updates on the City's website, www.lakeforestca.gov, and social media channels. With the success of 2022, I'm excited to see what 2023 brings. As always, thank you for the opportunity to serve you.



# CITY LAUNCHES CATALYTIC CONVERTER PROTECTION PROGRAM

The City of Lake Forest aims to reduce catalytic converter thefts by paying local repair shops to paint and etch identifying information onto the smog-reducing devices on residents' cars or shield them completely with metal plates.

Thefts of catalytic converters are up dramatically across the country because thieves can recycle precious metals in the devices for hundreds of dollars. Lake Forest averaged about 10 thefts a month when the City Council

approved the theft-deterrent plans in October of 2022. The programs launched in late January of this year.



Repair shops in Lake Forest can get \$125 to paint and etch the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) onto the catalytic converter of residents' vehicles, which makes it possible for authorities to prosecute anyone who steals the device. Residents can also get a \$250 gift card to help cover the costs of having a local shop install a shield to block access to their catalytic converter. The work must be performed at shops that applied to participate in the program and have been vetted by the City. Two are already approved for the etching and three for the shield installation.

The City Council approved \$30,000 for the etching program, enough to mark an estimated 240 vehicles, and \$30,000 for the shield program, enough to offset the costs of 113 shield installations. Visit www.lakeforestca.gov/en/CatGrant for more information.

# BUY ONE, GET ONE (BOGO) PROGRAM STIMULATES LOCAL ECONOMY

Local restaurants and retail businesses have received more than \$119,000 in revenue since the launch of the City's buy-one-get-one gift card program in December 2022. The program has allowed not only businesses but Lake Forest residents to reap the benefits.

The initiative has caught the eye of many and received praise. Those who buy an electronic gift card of \$25, \$50, or \$100 will receive a bonus card of equal value from the City. The cards can be used at any participating Lake Forest business. Residents have purchased more than 3,500 in gift cards so far, circulating \$300,000 in funds (BOGO + residents).

Over 40 restaurants, retail, automotive, and personal care businesses have enrolled —and the list continues to grow. Local businesses can participate in the program if they qualify and accept MasterCard credit card payments.

The Community Gift Card Program is designed to help restaurants, hospitality businesses, and other local stores rebound from COVID-19. City Council approved the \$565,000 program in early October last year. Funding for the initiative was supplied by the City's healthy, general fund. ## **AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROJECT SET FOR 2023 FINISH**

Drywall is up, windows and balcony railings are in, and siding installation is underway at the 71unit Mountain View affordable housing project off Raymond Way.

Construction has been ongoing since the groundbreaking in March 2022, allowing the project to be on track to finish in the summer of 2023.

Mountain View will offer one-, two-, and three-bedroom homes to individuals and families with a household income ranging from 30 to 60 percent of the area median income. Eight units will be reserved for those experiencing or at risk of homelessness in the region.

The application and eligibility process for Mountain View will begin in February/March. National Community Renaissance (National CORE) will handle all housing inquiries and applications. Those interested in the project can sign up for the property mailing list at bit.ly/MountainViewLF, and National CORE will email a flyer once the development nears completion.

Lake Forest has two more affordable housing projects in the works. The Senior Apartments at The Portola Center are under construction, and funding for the Senior Apartments at The Meadows was approved by City Council late last year. These two projects will add 122 units to the City once finished.

## **LOW-COST HOME IMPROVEMENT** LOANS AVAILABLE

Does your home need new stucco, windows, roofs, or other improvements? You might qualify for a zero-percent, deferred-interest home-improvement loan or a 3 percent interest loan through the City's Housing Rehabilitation Program.

The City Council funds the program with federal Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) funds to ensure residents can live in safe, efficient homes. Most home improvement items are eligible for assistance, such as plumbing, electrical, energy and weatherization items, garage doors, fumigation, flooring, and other items necessary for the health and safety of occupants.

Mobile home owners can receive up to \$15,000 and single-family homeowners can receive up to \$30,000. The zero-percent interest deferred loan has no monthly payments. Total payment is due if the resident is no longer residing in the home, at the time of sale, refinance, or transfer of title. The 3 percent interest loan requires monthly payments and is fully amortized over 15 years.


# LAKE FOREST LAUNCHES NEW WEBSITE

Those who go to www.lakeforestca.gov can find useful City information more quickly than ever, in a clean, easy to navigate layout.

The new City website is a comprehensive resource for both residents and visitors. The website provides information on city services, events, and news, as well as resources for businesses and community organizations. Since the launch in October 2022, 44,900 users have looked at the various pages in 64,000 sessions proving to be a widely used tool for the Lake Forest population.



The new layout was modeled to showcase the most-used features tracked through Google analytics for 2022 to provide the most user-friendly interface.


# NEW AND IMPROVED CITY APP

2022 was a busy year in Lake Forest. T new initiatives to sustain the City's q and economic deve

2022 saw the ground breakings for two housing projects: Mountain View and Portola Senior Apartments. Both projects will add 128 affordable housing units to Lake Forest once they are completed. The City Council also approved funding for the Meadows Senior Apartments, the fourth affordable-housing community in Lake Forest. The Meadows project, on Bake Parkway, will offer 65 units to seniors earning between 30 percent and 60 percent of the area's median income.

## PARK IMPROVEMENTS

The City completed playground resurfacing at Baker Ranch Community Park and El Toro Park, installing new cushioned surface material to improve safety. A flagpole with an American flag was installed at Veterans Park and construction for the last five parks of the Neighborhood Park Renovations project was initiated in 2022.









## INFRASTRUCTURE MAINTENANCE

The City enhanced Lake Forest's overall visual character in 2022 by maintaining critical infrastructure. Glenn Ranch Road from Portola Parkway to the City limits was resurfaced, Foothill Ranch communities were slurry sealed, and nearly 200 sidewalk repairs were made Citywide as a part of the Safe Step Improvement Project.

# **NEIGHBORHOOD** FOCUS



The City in 2022 launched the Southwest Lake Forest Task Force Project. Residents in certain areas of Southwest Lake Forest were surveyed by a consulting firm hired by the City to gain insight about neighborhood issues. An action plan was developed on the data collected and solutions to residents' concerns, such as additional lighting are completed or underway. In addition, the area will be the first to see installation of new blue street signs. The signs, with the City logo, will be installed in coming months.

## PET ADOPTION CENTER HERE TO HELP

Lake Forest has a unique collaboration with The Pet Adoption Center of Orange County (PAC-OC) for the benefit of Lake Forest residents and their pets. While OC Animal Care (OCAC) in Tustin is the municipal animal shelter responsible for providing animal control and sheltering services to the City, the PAC-OC in Lake Forest is a resource that supplements animal care assistance for residents. The PAC-OC provides education, prevention, and other resources based on individual pets and families' needs.

OCAC is the contact for pickup of stray, injured, and dead animals, licensing, and locating your lost pet. Call (714) 935-6848 from 8 am-5 pm. For after-hours field services needs, call (714) 259-1122, or visit www.ocpetinfo.com for more information.

If you find a stray cat, unless it is sick or injured, OCAC recommends taking it to a vet to scan for a microchip, then placing it back where you found it, to find its way home. For more information on lost or found pets, read: www.ocpetinfo.com/news/what-do-if-you-lose-or-find-pet.

The PAC-OC helps provide dog adoptions, assist residents in need with rehoming their pets and other assistance such as obtaining low-cost pet care services to Lake Forest residents through clinic events, as well as for individual needs.

Look for PAC-OC throughout the community in 2023 as they sponsor or participate in events. The center has many volunteer opportunities for adults, as well as for students 16-17 years old—with an adult volunteering with them.

The PAC-OC tries to help Lake Forest owners with their pets prior to taking them to the County shelter. If the PAC-OC is unable to assist, we can provide referrals to other resources. PAC-OC also offers counseling to those who would like to keep their pets but are having difficulties. Stray or abandoned pets must go to OC Animal Care.

# **EXPAND THE FOREST**—A LANDSCAPE IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

Expand the Forest is a landscape-improvement project that encourages citizen participation in tree planting and provides an opportunity to enhance the City's urban forest.

An Expand the Forest memorial tree is \$93. The application includes an approved tree palette and available parks. Citizen sponsors receive a formal Certificate of Dedication signed by the City Council.

The spring planting season is March 1 to June 1. Visit www.lakeforestca.gov/en/departments/public-works/expand-forest for more details and an application.

## How to Participate and Apply

An application is required for participants of the Expand the Forest program. The application includes a selected tree palette of approved trees and available parks. Note that each park is preplanned to accommodate specific tree types and locations, so not all types of trees will be available for all

Submit an application indicating your tree and park preference, along with a check for \$93 made out to "The City of Lake Forest." The fee includes a 15 gallon tree, location study, planting, staking, fertilization, and other maintenance as needed.

# GREEN SPRING CLEANING AND GARDENING

Have you noticed that your garage, your patio, and all around your home, there is a buildup of dirt and debris? Perhaps you have seen garden pests on your favorite flowers? As the spring weather urges you to start working outdoors, it is important to remember that anything that gets washed down to the gutter ends up in our local creeks, lakes, and the ocean. Utilizing green alternatives can protect local resources from pollution such as pesticides.

Here are a few helpful tips to clean and protect your home using common household items, while also protecting our local creeks, lakes, and the ocean!



#### **GREEN GARDENING AND PEST CONTROL**

A combination of preventative maintenance and green insect repellents can keep insects out of your home and garden. Insects are looking for food, water and shelter – if you eliminate these necessities, they won't forage in your home or your garden!

- Keep plants trimmed at least three or four feet away from doors and window frames to eliminate these common pest entrances.
- Trim overhanging tree limbs that might provide an insect or rodent on-ramp to your home.
- Check the areas around your home for any debris or garbage – identify anything that could be used by pests as shelter - and get rid of it.

Did you know a variety of common household items can be used to repel insects?

 The strong smell of garlic and cayenne can be used to deter a variety of bugs, especially aphids. Chopping 6 cloves of garlic and mixing them with 1 tbsp. of baby shampoo in 4 cups of water in a spray bottle creates an effective repellent for your rose bushes.

- Mixing 5 tablespoons of dish soap with 4 cups of water in a spray bottle can be used to deter aphids and spider mites.
- Spices like black pepper, chili pepper, dill, ginger and paprika contain capsaicin, which repels spider mites and other insects. Make a solution of 2 tablespoons red pepper, 6 drops of dish soap and 4 cups of water for deterring insects on your growing vegetables.
- Coffee and crushed eggshells can be sprinkled around the base of plants to repel ants, snails, and slugs (and they are great on azaleas, rhododendrons, camellias, gardenias and even blueberries!).
- To keep wasps away from ripening fruit, fill several cans with equal parts ammonia and water, and hang them among your fruit trees.
- Crushed mint, bay leaves, cloves and eucalyptus wrapped in small cheesecloth squares can also be hung in your home and your garden as a natural repellent.

#### **GREEN CLEANING**

Using green cleaning methods can prevent the transfer of pollutants to the storm drain system!

- Use a broom and a dustpan to clean your patio and outdoor walkways instead of a hose.
- Use a spray nozzle on your hose with an automatic shut-off and turn the flow of water completely off when not actively washing down your automobile.
- Cleaning your patio furniture on your lawn or other landscaped areas can save you water by providing your plants with a drink, and it keeps our gutters clean too!
- Wash vehicles over pervious surfaces like lawns and gravel areas. If unpaved areas are not available, block and/or divert wash water towards other landscaped areas, like planters. If using cleaners (such as acid based wheel cleaners), use a rag to wipe them on and off, do not rinse them off with water.
- Shake floor mats onto landscaping, into trash cans or vacuum to clean, never shake off in the gutter.

## LAKE FOREST ADDS NEW E-BIKE LAWS

The Lake Forest General Plan specifically encourages the City to support and promote safe bicycle use throughout the city.

But the key word is "safe." The City routinely receives multiple reports of riders using electric bikes in a manner that's anything but safe.

In fact, the City held a town hall meeting about electric bikes with the Orange County Sheriff's Department and Providence Mission Hospital in 2021 after Mission's trauma department reported an astronomic rise in e-bike injuries. It's still happening: the hospital saw 198 e-bike injuries between January and October of 2022. That's up from 113 in 2021 and 34 in 2020. Many of the injuries came when riders weren't wearing helmets.

In response to the complaints, and accidents, the City launched a webpage dedicated to explaining the different types of e-bikes on the market and the requirements for each.

But education is not enough. The City continues to get complaints about unsafe e-bike use. The City Council strengthened ordinances on e-bike use in December. The key language in the ordinance is that "no person shall operate a bicycle or an electric bicycle in any manner that endangers any person ..."

Anyone riding a bike – including an e-bike – on a sidewalk must do so in a reasonable and prudent speed that does not endanger others. The speed limit on the street is 10 mph and 5 mph on sidewalks, according to the new ordinances. Finally, it also makes it clear that anyone under 18 must wear a helmet while riding an e-bike.

The City also asked the Orange County Sheriff's Department to step up e-bike safety enforcement efforts. E-bikes can be impounded for unsafe use.

Those who see any cyclist – on any sort of bike – riding unsafely, should call the OCSD non-emergency line at (949) 770-6011.

# NEIGHBOR HELPING NEIGHBOR

The Lake Forest Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) is growing! Watch it grow – or better yet, come join the team.

The Lake Forest CERT program was established five years ago, and already has over 100 Lake Forest residents who have participated in the program.

CERT is a federal program that teach residents how to help each other in the wake of a major emergency. Participants in the free program attend a session a week for eight weeks, learning everything from emergency first aid to disaster psychology.

The success of the program allowed the creation of an Oversight Committee of Lake Forest residents/CERT graduates to assist in planning events and training. Two new trainers, from the CERT-LF team, are teaching the current course, which began in January.
