City Street Signs Receive a Makeover

Look out for new street signs! The City will replace the standard green street signs throughout neighborhoods and overhead traffic signals as part of the Citywide Street Name Sign project.

The decision to redesign the street signs supports the City's Strategic Plan for maintaining the attractiveness of Lake Forest.

The new street signs will have a reflective blue background with the black-and-white image of the City logo. The signs are more cost-effective than the standard County of Orange street signs and will help distinguish Lake Forest from surrounding cities such as Laguna Hills and Mission Viejo.

City Council approved \$300,000 for this project, but staff plans to propose a budget adjustment once the quote for the project is finalized.
