

REMEMBER ON COLLECTION DAY

- 1 Place carts at the curbside no later than 6:30 a.m. on collection day and remove from the curbside within 12 hours after service.
- 2 Place carts with the handles and wheels facing towards your home.
- 3 Place carts side-by-side approximately 1 foot apart and at least 3 feet from any obstruction (i.e. vehicles, fire hydrants, trees).
- 4 Items placed outside of carts will not be collected. Cart lids should be closed. Please do not overload.

TEMPORARY COLLECTIONS

Larger waste collection containers (from 3 yards to 40 yards) are available for clean-up projects and other disposal needs. For additional pricing details or to arrange for a delivery of a larger container to your residence or business, please call CR&R Customer Service.



BULKY ITEMS

Items that cannot fit in your automated carts are considered bulky items. Bulky items must be manageable by a two-person crew.

EXAMPLES OF BULKY ITEMS INCLUDE:

- Couches
- Desks
- Chairs
- Tables
- Mattresses

Each residential customer is entitled to [2] bulky item pick-ups free-of-charge per calendar year. A bulky item service may include a combination of [4] large items or [20] bags of material. Additional pick-ups may be arranged for a nominal charge.

WHITE GOODS - HOUSEHOLD APPLIANCES

White goods and household appliances containing freon are picked up similar to a bulky item. CR&R will collect bulky items and white goods from your curbside. White goods with Freon, such as a refrigerator or air conditioner, are collected for a charge.

E-WASTE

Electronic Waste [e-Waste] is anything with a circuit board, battery, or powercord. It is illegal to dispose of e-Waste in any of your automated carts. CR&R will collect and legally dispose and recycle these items for a nominal fee.

EXAMPLES OF E-WASTE INCLUDE:

- Monitors
- Printers
- Televisions
- Cell Phones

UNIVERSAL WASTE

Universal wastes are hazardous wastes that contain mercury, lead, cadmium, copper and other substances hazardous to human and environmental health. In general, universal waste may not be discarded in solid waste landfills or placed in any of your automated carts. If you have the following universal waste items, CR&R will collect them from your residence for a charge. These items include:

- Thermostats, High Intensity Discharge Lamps
- Household Batteries
- Fluorescent Tubes and Bulbs
- Mercury containing devices

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Household Hazardous Wastes (HHW) are products that are flammable, corrosive, reactive or toxic. They are dangerous to the public and environment. It is illegal to dispose of HHW in any of your automated carts.

EXAMPLES INCLUDE:

- Automotive Fluids
- Propane
- Paint and Solvents
- Cleaning Products
- Medical Sharps
- Pesticides
- Fertilizers
- Herbicides
- Pool Chemicals
- Non-empty Aerosol Cans

The County of Orange operates year-round drop off centers. The nearest center is located in Irvine. For hours of operation or more information on HHW centers, contact the County of Orange at 714.834.6752 or oclandfills.com.

CR&R also holds two HHW Drop-off Events each year at a location and date to be announced.

HOLIDAY SCHEDULE OF NON-COLLECTION DAYS

New Year's Day	Labor Day
Memorial Day	Thanksgiving Day
Independence Day	Christmas Day

If the Holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, trash will be collected on your normal collection day with no delays to your pickup.

If the Holiday falls during the work week, collection for the remainder of the week will be delayed by one day. For example, if Independence Day falls on a Monday, and your normal collection day is on Thursday, your pickup for that week will be on Friday.

Compostable bags are optional and available at local retailers. Other types of plastic bags are not accepted. You may also line your cart with newspaper or paper bags.



CR&R provides a Christmas tree collection for a two week period following Christmas Day. The following guidelines are for residential curbside collection of Christmas trees.

- Please remove all ornaments, tinsel, lights and stand.
- Do not place trees in plastic bags.
- Place tree in your organics cart or beside your carts for collection.
- Trees 6 feet or taller must be cut in half.



Palm fronds are **NOT** recyclable. Please place cut palm fronds in the landfill cart.
